Marion Township's Tornado Siren

The Tornado sirens are tested on the first Thursday of every month at 9:00 am. Sirens are located at County Farm & Sexton Roads and the other siren is located on D-19 near Triangle Lake Rd. They are projected to be heard for a one mile radius.

Township Park #1
