2010 Census Update

During the 2000-2010 decade, Livingston County had the second largest population change among Michigan's 83 counties. The county gained 24,016 new residents, an increase of 15.3%.

Marion Township's change in population was 3,252, or 48.2%, and was the 11th fastest growing township in the state by percentage.
